



Math or Magic?

This math trick will amaze your friends. Your friends choose any number they want, and then they all do the same math problem. No matter which number they select, their answer will always. First, tell your friends to think of a number greater than zero (e.g., 5). Next, they should multiply their number by itself (5 x 5 = 25). After that, they should add their answer to their original number (25 + 5 = 30). Now they should **divide** their new total by their original number (30 \div 5 = 6). In the last steps, your friends should add 17 (6 + 17 = 23) and then subtract their original number from this last total (23 - 5 = 18). Finally, they should divide their answer by six $(18 \div 6 = 3)$. The final Try it on your friends. They are sure to be

impressed!
