 a place where you go to study a special
 subject after you've left school • My dad never
 went to university because he started working
 when he was 16. * جامعة

 a doctor who takes care of the health of animals as a job The vet gave Lena some medicine for her sick cat.
- 9.3 dentist (n) /'dentist/ a person who takes care of people's teeth as a job • I have to go to the dentist because my tooth hurts. > dental (adj)
- 9.4 cleaner (n) /'kliːnə(r)/ a person who cleans inside people's houses or other buildings as a job ● The school cleaner washes the desks and floors in our school after we go home.
- 9.5 mechanic (n) /məˈkænɪk/ a person who fixes machines, like car engines, as a job ● The mechanic quickly found out what was wrong with Dana's car.

- 9.6 guide (n) /gaɪd/ a person who takes people to interesting places and gives information about them
 The guide told us some interesting facts about Ancient Sparta.
- 9.7 veterinary (adj) /'vetrənəri/ related to caring for the health of animals
 The zoo has a veterinary dentist to take care of the animals' teeth.
- 9.8 wildlife (n) /'waɪldlaɪf/ animals and plants that live naturally in an area • The fire across the countryside was a disaster for the wildlife there. So many animals died or lost their homes.
- 9.9 especially (adv) /ɪˈspeʃəli/ more than other things ● I love art, especially drawing people. ♦ بخاصةً
- 9.10 dental (adj) /'dentl/ related to teeth • *If you clean your teeth every day, you'll protect them from dental problems.* خاص بالأسنان *

- 9.11 pain (n) /peɪn/ a bad feeling in your body when you're hurt or ill • She has a terrible pain in her leg and she thinks it's broken.
- 9.12 window cleaner (n) /'wɪndəʊ kliːnə(r)/ sb who cleans windows as a job ● We pay a window cleaner to clean the outside of our windows once a month. ♦ عامل تنظيف النوافذ
- 9.13 training course (n) /'treining kois/ lessons to prepare you for a job ● Ellen is doing a training course to become a teacher.
 ♦ دورة تدريبية
- 9.14 abseil (v) /'æbseIl/ move down a rope on a straight rock face or wall using your feet and hands ● You have to be very brave or crazy to abseil down the outside of Europe's highest building.
 > abseiling (n) ◆ الهبوط من قمم الجبال
- 9.15 earn (v) /3ːn/ to get sth, usually money, for doing or making sth ● Photography is fun, but it's a hard way to earn money. ➤ earnings (n pl) � يكسب
- 9.16 overland (adj) /'əʊvəlænd/ involving travelling across land, not across the sea or by plane ● The overland train journey across Europe took them five days.

- 9.18 passenger (n) /ˈpæsɪndʒə(r)/ a person who is travelling in a car or a train, etc. but isn't driving it • The passengers were waiting for the plane when they heard the announcement. * مسافر/راكب
- 9.19 put up (sth) (phr v) /pʊt up ('sʌmθɪŋ)/ to build or place sth • Don't put up your tents too close to the river. ♦ يُشيد
- 9.20 break down (phr v) /breik daon/ stop working because of a mechanical problem
 Ron couldn't drive to work because his car broke down. > breakdown (adj, n)

- 9.21 jungle (n) /'dʒʌŋgl/ a thick tropical forest ● Maureen is exploring the Amazon jungle to find unusual plants.
 ♦ غابة

- 9.22 desert (n) /'dezət/ a large area of land that is very dry and hot • The tour guide took us on a camel ride across the hot desert sand. ❖ صحراء
- 9.23 steep (adj) /stiːp/ describing a slope that goes up or down very quickly • I had to get off my bicycle and push it up the steep hill. * منحدر شدید
- 9.24 vehicle (n) /'vi:əkl/ sth that people can travel in from place to place, e.g. car, bus, truck • *It was difficult for* vehicles to travel along the mountain road in the snow. مركبة *
- 9.25 lorry (n) /'lori/ a very big vehicle for carrying things by road
 We put all our furniture into the lorry to move to our new home.
 Syn: truck
- 9.26 panic (v) /'pænīk/ to suddenly feel so frightened that you can't think clearly ● Don't panic when you see the exam questions, just do your best. > panic (n), panic-stricken (adj) ♦ هلع
- 9.27 season (n) /'si:zn/ one of the four parts of the year; spring, summer, autumn or winter ● My favourite season is summer, when the weather is warm.

- 9.28 physically (adv) /'fɪzɪkli/ related to the body ● *lf you do a sport, you will feel better physically.* > physical (adj) بدنيًا ♦
