cheap • *A simple meal of pasta with cheese is inexpensive to buy and quick to make.*

one of the things put with others to make sth
• *The main ingredient of this sauce is cheese.*

- 2.34** **regular** (adj) /'regjələ(r)/
that is often done as a habit; that happens often or usually • *Nick is a regular visitor to the library. He reads a lot of books every week.*

a meal of meat and/or vegetables cooked slowly like a thick soup • *In winter, the Irish make traditional hot stew with meat and vegetables.* ❖ der Eintopf
