## LOOK!

The verbs *treat* and *cure* have a similar meaning as both of them refer to medical care and treatment of diseases. We use *treat* to say that sb is receiving medical care for a disease, but we don't know whether they'll be cured and be healthy again. On the other hand, we use *cure* to say that sb has been treated and is well.

- → The hospital has treated 40 cases of the disease in the last month.
- → She was now completely **cured** of her disease.
