**4.13 stamp** (v) /stæmp/ - dupat to put your foot down heavily ● *The children clapped their hands and stamped their feet to the music.* ❖

**4.14 label** (n) /'leɪbl/ - etiketa; visačka a piece of paper/plastic attached to sth with information about price, material, etc. • *The label says this T-shirt is made of cotton.* ➤ label (v) ❖

**4.15 running water** (n) /'rʌnɪŋ 'wɔːtə(r)/ - tekoucí voda

water that comes directly into a building and comes out of a tap • Sadly, there are many poor countries where people have no running water in their homes. ❖
