- **5.10 orbit** (v) /'ɔːbɪt/ obíhat okolo move or make sth move in a circle around sth else *It takes the Earth a year to orbit the sun.* ➤ orbit (n) ❖
- 5.11 impact (n) /'Impækt/ dopad; náraz the force with which sth hits sth else The scientists calculated the impact of the asteroid hitting our planet. ➤ impact (v) ❖ 5.12 record (v) /rɪˈkɔːd/ zaznamenat write down information so that you can keep it for the future The police recorded every move the suspect made. ➤ record (n) ❖
- 5.13 precise (adj) /priˈsaɪs/ přesný exact I can give you a general outline, but I don't yet know the precise details of what happened. ➤ precision (n) ❖ 5.14 planetary (adj) / plænɪtəri/ planetární
- related to planets There are thousands of planetary systems in our galaxy. ➤ planet (n) ❖
- **5.15 defence** (n) /dɪˈfens/ obrana protection against attack or criticism When the bullies attacked her brother, she leapt to his defence. ➤ defend (v), defensive (adj) ❖
- **5.16 collision** (n) /kəˈlɪʒn/ srážka; střet an accident in which two moving objects or people crash into each other *The pilot avoided the collision by changing course at the last minute.* ➤ collide (v) ❖
- **5.17 decrease** (v) /dr kri:s/ snížit se make or become smaller As a result of the new measures, crime in inner city areas has decreased by 10%. ➤ decrease (n) ❖ Syn: reduce

5.18 military (adj) /ˈmɪlɪtri/ - vojenský related to the army ● *The soldiers were wearing brown military uniforms.* ❖ **5.19 eager** (adj) /ˈiːgə(r)/ - horlivý; dychtivý

wanting to do sth very much • The staff were all very kind and eager to help us.

➤ eagerness (n) ❖ ❖ Syn: willing

5.20 remote-control (adj) /rɪˌməʊt kənˈtrəʊl/ - dálkově ovládaný that you can control from a distance • The car has remote-control central locking.

Just press this button and all the doors will automatically lock. ❖

5.21 aid (n) /eid/ - pomoc money, food or other supplies that an organisation or country gives to a group of people in need or to a poor country

Thousands of lives will be saved when the aid arrives in the country.

5.23 assignment (n) /əˈsaɪnmənt/ - úkol a task that you ask sb to do as part of their job or studies • They sent him abroad on a very difficult assignment. ➤ assign (v) ❖ 5.24 survivor (n) /səˈvaɪvə(r)/ - přeživší a person who continues to live after experiencing great danger or difficulty • Unfortunately, there were only two survivors of the plane crash. ➤ survive (v), survival (n) ❖

5.25 flood (n) /fl∧d/ - povodeň a large amount of water covering an area that is normally dry • The heavy rain has caused floods all over the country. ➤ flood (v) ❖

5.26 transport (v) /træn'spo:t/ - přepravit move goods or people from one place to another • *Most products are transported by road across the country.* ➤ transport (n), transportation (n) ❖

5.27 vital (adj) /'vartl/ - životně důležitý; zásadní

necessary or extremely important • The mayor's support is vital to the success of the project. �

5.28 poacher (n) /'pəʊtʃə(r)/ - pytlák sb that hunts animals illegally ● Unfortunately, poachers are still killing elephants and rhinos. ❖

5.29 capture (v) /'kæpt $\int a(r)/-odchytit$; zajmout

a place from which they can't escape ●

They capture wild animals and sell them to

zoos. ➤ capture (n), captive (adj) ❖

5.30 sense (v) /sens/ - vycítit

feel or experience sth ● I could sense that

he wasn't happy although he said he was.

➤ sense (n) ❖

catch a person or animal and keep them in

5.31 astrophysicist (n) / æstrəʊˈfɪzɪsɪst/ - astrofyzik

a scientist who studies stars and other objects in space • Some astrophysicists believe it is possible that human beings will move to other planets in the near future. ➤ astrophysics (n) ❖

5.32 equipped (adj) /ɪˈkwɪpt/ - vybavený having the necessary tools and clothes for a particular purpose ● *Our kitchen is equipped with all modern appliances.* ➤ equip (v), equipment (n) ❖

5.33 acronym (n) /ˈækrənɪm/ - písmenná zkratka

an abbreviation that is pronounced as a word ● NASA is an acronym for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. ❖

5.34 rough (adj) /rʌf/ - hrubý; přibližný not exact ● I think I have a rough idea of what you mean, but can you give me more details? ❖ ❖ Opp: precise, exact
5.35 highlight (v) /'haɪlaɪt/ - zdůraznit emphasise sth important ● The study highlights the need to take measures urgently. ❖ ❖ Syn: emphasise

5.36 illegally (adv) /ɪˈliːgəli/ - nezákonně; nedovoleně in a way that breaks the law • I got a fine for parking illegally. ➤ illegal (adj) ❖
∴ Opp: legally

5.41 browse (v) /braʊz/ - procházet look at information on the internet ● I found your site while I was browsing and I thought it was amazing. ➤ browser (n) ❖ 5.42 display (v) /dr'spleɪ/ - zobrazit show sth on a screen ● The screen will display the name of the current user in the top righthand corner. ➤ display (n) ❖ 5.43 undo (v) /∧n'du:/ - zrušit cancel sth that you did previously on a computer ● On a computer you can easily undo something if you change your mind.

5.44 upgrade (v) /np'greɪd/ - vyměnit za novější; zmodernizovat; upgradovat replace a machine or system with a newer or better one • *It's time to upgrade my*

*

phone – I've had it for ten years.

Opp: downgrade

5.45 virtually (adv) /'vɜːtʃuəli/ - virtuálně done or seen using a computer or the internet, without going anywhere or meeting people in person ● You can join our class virtually from the comfort of your home. ➤ virtual (adj) ❖

5.46 anti-virus (adj) / ænti varərəs/ - antivirus

protecting a computer from programs that can harm it ● You should use a good antivirus program that protects you without slowing down your computer. ❖

5.47 broadband (n) /'bro:dbænd/ širokopásmový přenos
a system that allows a lot of information
to be shared between computers via the
internet ● Most homes have broadband
internet access these days. ❖

5.48 database (n) /'deɪtəbeɪs/ - databáze a large amount of information stored on a computer so that it can be easily accessed and used ● We have more than 10,000 names and addresses in our database. ❖ 5.49 desktop (n) /'desktop/ - stolní počítač; plocha obrazovky a computer that fits on a desk and is not intended to be carried around ● I have a powerful desktop at work, but just use a tablet at home. ❖

5.50 headset (n) /'hedset/ - sluchátka s mikrofonem

a set of headphones with a microphone
I use a headset to listen to music, so as not to disturb other people.

5.51 hard drive (n) / haːd ˌdraɪv/ - pevný disk

a disk inside a computer or other device where large amounts of information can be stored and used ● The hard drive on my laptop isn't as big as the one on my desktop. ❖ Syn: hard disk

5.52 password (n) /ˈpɑːswɜːd/ - heslo a series of letters, numbers and/or

symbols that you must type into a

computer to be able to use it ● You can't access these files unless you have the password. 💠

5.53 network (n) / netws:k/ - síť a number of computers that are connected together so that they can share information • All the computers in our office are on the same network so we can easily send large files to each other. � 5.54 wireless (adj) / waɪələs/ - bezdrátový using radio signals rather than cables or wires to connect devices to each other • You can control your wireless speaker from a distance, using your phone. �

5.55 virtual reality (n) / va:tjuəl riˈælɪti/ virtuální realita

a set of images and sounds produced by a computer which represent a real place or situation • The use of virtual reality in computer games makes the experience much more engaging. �

5.57 hacker (n) / hækə(r)/ - hacker a person that knows a lot about computers and accesses private computer systems illegally • A hacker can break into your computer and steal all of the information you store there. ➤ hack (v) ❖

5.104 deadline (n) /'dedlaɪn/ - termín the time by which sth must be completed

- I thought it wouldn't be difficult to meet the deadline, but there was so much work that in the end I missed it. �
- **5.105 complicated** (adj) /ˈkɒmplɪkeɪtɪd/ komplikovaný

having a lot of different parts that are difficult to understand ● The lecture was very complicated and I found it hard to follow. ➤ complicate (v), complication (n)
