



Present continuous

Past continuous

Mr Marks **was cleaning** the swimming pool all morning. (active sentence)
The swimming pool **was being cleaned by** Mr Marks all morning. (passive sentence)

Present perfect simple

Diane **has worn** this coat before. (active sentence)
This coat **has been worn by** Diane before. (passive sentence)

Past perfect simple

Jenny **had posted** the letter. (active sentence) The letter **had been posted** by Jenny. (passive sentence)

Future simple

The mechanic **will fix** the car very soon. (active sentence)
The car **will be fixed by** the mechanic very soon. (passive sentence)

Future perfect simple

Peter **will have finished** the project by tomorrow. (active sentence)
The project **will have been finished** by Peter by tomorrow. (passive sentence)

Modals

The police **must interview** the witnesses. (active sentence)
The witnesses **must be interviewed** by the police. (passive sentence)
