Use possessive adjectives to talk about objects, people, and places.

Subject pronouns	Possessive adjectives	
I	my	I have my ticket.
you	your	Do you have your passport?
he	his	His parents are Italian.
she	her	Her father's from Argentina.
it	its	Venice is famous for its canals.
we	our	Our camera's a Nikon.
they	their	Their daughter's a doctor.

A possessive adjective has one form for singular and plural: *his brother, his parents*.

**Key vocabulary** Everyday objects: credit card, glasses, laptop, cell phone, passport, ticket

Adjectives: awful, awesome, fantastic, great, terrible

People in your life: mother, father, parents, son, daughter, children, husband, wife, brother, sister
