Presentation

Present continuous

Use the present continuous to talk about a fixed arrangement in the future. We often mention a time.

I'm getting a train in half an hour.

We're meeting my friends at nine.

be going to

Use *be going to* + infinitive to talk about general plans and intentions.

I'm going to order steak.

What are you going to order?

will

Use *will* (without *to*):

- to make a decision when speaking:

I'm not sure. I think I'll have fish ... Or maybe I'll have steak.


- to make promises and offers:

I promise I'll pay.

I'll get the bill.
